DSMES SERVICES
AT-A-GLANCE

A quick reference about diabetes self-management education and support (DSMES) services that can improve health outcomes for your patients



Consider referring your patients to diabetes self-management education and support (DSMES) services that are highly effective in improving the health and diabetes management skills of people with diabetes in ways that fit their lifestyle.

- Studies have shown that DSMES services can lead to decreases in AIC levels, prevention or delay of diabetes complications, and improved quality of life.
- The American Diabetes Association (ADA) and the Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists (ADCES) accredit or recognize diabetes programs providing DSMES services that meet required national standards.
- Insurance coverage of DSMES services varies, but many private and state Medicaid plans cover it, as well as Medicare. Consider referring your patients to DSMES services.
- Research shows that patients count on their health care provider more than any other source of information to help them manage a serious chronic condition like diabetes.

### What are DSMES Services?

Patients can receive DSMES services one-to-one or in a group, and in person or online, where they:

- Work with a diabetes care and education specialist (DCES), also known as a diabetes educator, to set and track goals
- Learn to manage diabetes using knowledge, skills, and tools
- Build confidence and emotional strength
- Practice how to fit diabetes care into all their daily routines
- Find ways to get support (in person and online) from their:
  - Family
  - Friends
  - Community
  - Health care team.

### **Benefits to DSMES Services Referral**

For your patients, DSMES services can help:

- ✓ Improve hemoglobin AIC
- Prevent or delay diabetes complications
- ✓ Increase the likelihood of patients getting preventive health care
- Reduce acute care and hospitalizations
- Improve healthy coping, confidence in self-care behaviors, and quality of life.

The benefits to you of referring your patients to DSMES services include:

- Fewer readmissions
- Improved quality measures
- Less time spent on patient education and management.

### **Requirements for DSMES Services**

- A documented diagnosis of type 1,
   type 2, or gestational diabetes, including:
  - ► Fasting blood glucose: ≥126 mg/dL on two separate occasions
  - 2-hour post-glucose challenge:≥200 mg/dL on two separate occasions
  - Random glucose test:>200 mg/dL with symptoms of uncontrolled diabetes
- Written referral from a treating health care provider

## **DSMES Services Delivery**

- One-to-one or in a group
- In person or online
- In clinical or community settings
- By solo or teams of providers

NOTE: The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) uses the term diabetes self-management "training" (DSMT) instead of "education and support" (DSMES) when defining the reimbursable benefit (DSMT). The term DSMT relates specifically to Medicare billing.

#### When to Refer Your Patients

There are four key times to refer:

- 1. At diagnosis
- 2. Annually (or when not meeting treatment targets)
- 3. When complicating factors develop
- 4. When a transition in life or care happens.

- 2. If you find a program in your area, contact them and ask how to refer.
- **3.** If you do NOT find a program in your area, you can:
  - Reach out to your <u>state health department</u>
    or the <u>National Association of Chronic</u>
    <u>Disease Directors</u> to find your DSMES State
    Specialist who may know about programs
    not included in the program locators yet, or
  - Contact an online program (in the program locator tools above).
  - Explore offering DSMES services. You may be able to offer and bill for DSMES services that you can provide to your patients directly.
